

Your Role: Lead, Serve, Save Lives







Hybrid FAQ's

- Hybrid course fee
 - \$95 same as in person delivery
- Technician Guide shipment
 - Technician Guides will be shipped to one location, instructor team will facilitate distribution

Hybrid FAQ's

- Instructor ratio
 - 1 instructor to 5 students
- Instructor Candidacy
 - The hybrid course is not an option to complete instructor candidacy

Hybrid FAQ's

- Instructor hours
 - Skills evaluations, Hands on activities, leading/coleading a virtual checkpoint
 - Can earn up to 8 course administration hours for video review and office hours
 - Mentoring hours are not available
